OUR HISTORY


Our Beginning: Our church started as an act of God's love for our community. WPC was established on November 9, 1873 inside the railroad station. Our goal was to welcome and care for commuters and their families.

Our Foundation: It took a decade before the first physical church was built in 1883 at our current location. We rebuilt the church twice, with the third reconstruction after the 1956 sanctuary fire. There have been crucial renovation projects over the years. We worked to raise the necessary funds, and together, always found a way forward.

Our Blessings: WPC is a beacon of love. It has been the site of countless worship services, baptisms, weddings, and memorial services. Sunday school has been taught, prayers have been spoken, neighbors have been fed and housed, and love has been shared in this sacred space.

Our Legacy: The time has come to address urgent projects that require immediate attention. This will enable us to continue to live a legacy of love into the future!







OUR PRIORITIES

We have defined four priorities, which will be addressed through urgent renewal projects funded by this capital campaign:



Hospitality

We want to continue being a welcoming and inclusive place for members and visitors alike.



Accessibility

We want everyone to be able to access our entire building without major obstacles getting in the way.



Family Friendly

We want to nurture and support our families and children as our church continues to grow.



Preservation & Sustainability

We want to preserve and maintain our beautiful facilities, including the church and manse, for long-term sustainability.

CHURCH RENEWAL PLANS

The Session has thoughtfully compiled a list of critical renewal projects. Some of them are urgent, long overdue maintenance that must be addressed in order to prevent any further deterioration of our buildings. They also fall outside of our annual operating budget.

Additionally, these projects enable us to be more welcoming to our growing congregation. We have welcomed 40 new members over the past year and a half, most of whom are families with young children. This is the first sign of significant growth in over three decades.

Now is the time to ensure that we are passing down a lasting legacy to our youngest disciples, who are the future of WPC.

In order to make Hospitality, Accessibility, Family Friendliness, and Sustainability a priority, we hope to accomplish the following renewal projects:

Church Renewal Projects, Phases I & II

Phase I (Beginning Spring 2024)

Sanctuary/Fellowship Hall Accessibility	\$3,000
Exterior Signs for the Church	\$4,500
Church Roof Repair	\$8,000
Church Chimney Repair	\$8,500
Bypass Valves for Sprinkler/Sewer	\$12,000
Elevator Controls Replacement	\$41,000
New Hymnals for Worship (\$25/hymnal)	\$4,500
New Website/Rebranding	\$5,000
Manse Backyard Fence	\$5,750

Total Phase I Projects: \$92,250

Phase II (Over the Next 5 Years)

Fellowship Hall French Doors Replacement	\$15,000
Heating Pipes Replacement or Pipes Bypass in the Church and School, As Needed	\$15,000
Church Window Replacement, As Needed	\$127,750

Total Phase II Projects: \$157,750

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN TOTAL: \$250,000, to be raised over the next three years.


