Home Worship Guideline

If you are eating and worshipping solo, use each section as a journal prompt or a moment of personal reflection and consider writing a letter to yourself or to a trusted friend to continue the conversation. Remember that wherever you are, the Spirit of God binds us together and we are never alone.

THANKSGIVING FOR THE MEAL

Introduce yourself and discuss:

Share the words of the blessing, thanksgiving, prayer that you remember from childhood, if any. Do you say thanks when you eat at home now? When are you out at restaurants?

Enjoy the Food, Fellowship and Sharing

Enjoy the food and time together. You might share what kind of ***pancake*** and ***syrup*** is your favorite (plain, wheat, blueberry, pecan, etc.) and what kind of ***cake*** is your favorite. What food /meal is your favorite?

Share a story about a special family meal (friend meal) that you will remember always. How old were you? Who made the food? Who was there, etc.? What made it special?

What food would be the hardest food to give up and not eat for 2 whole months!?

Belonging to God Catechism

Table Talk – Choose a person to act as the "One," who will guide the conversation at the table. Share the question and discuss each answer briefly. Before moving to the next Q&A, "memorize" aloud by repeating it together 3 times.

One: Question 1. Who are you?

ALL: I am a child of God.

One: Question 2. What does it mean to be a child of God?

ALL: That I belong to God, who loves me.

One: Question 3. What makes you a child of God?

ALL: Grace -- God's free gift of love that I do not deserve and cannot earn.

One: Question 4. Don't you have to be good for God to love you?

ALL: No. God loves me in spite of all I do wrong.

One: Question 5. How do you thank God for this gift of love?

ALL: I promise to love and trust God with all my heart.

One: Question 6. How do you love God?

ALL: By worshipping God, by loving others, and by respecting what God has created.

Contemplative Silence

Matthew 6: 1-2 *"Beware of practicing your righteousness before others in order to be seen by them, for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others."*

Affirmation

One: God is our refuge and strength, a present help in trouble.

**ALL: Therefore, we will not fear though the earth should change,
though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea;
though the waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.
God's love endures forever.**

Prayer of Confession

ALL: Holy and merciful God, we confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

ALL: Have mercy on us, O God.

One: ...your Holy Spirit. **ALL: Have mercy on us, O God.**

One: ...in daily life and work. **ALL: Have mercy on us, O God.**

One: ...toward those who differ from us, **ALL: Have mercy on us, O God.**

One: ...show us your steadfast love. **ALL: Have mercy on us, O God.**

ALL: Restore us, O God of our salvation and show us your steadfast love. Turn to us in your mercy and redeem us.

Gospel

One: Hear the good news according to John:

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him but that the world might be saved through him.

And in Matthew, the gracious words of our redeemer Jesus Christ:

“Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.”
